All timber, logs or other lumber cut upon unlicensed Crown Land, or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no Timber or Lumber shall be cut on any berth applied for until it shall be purchased at public auction.

BRIDGE NOTICE

Sealed tenders, marked tender for Thoroughfare Bridge Superstructure will be received at the Department of Public Works, Fredericton, until Wednesday, 28th day of May, 1924, at 5 o'clock p.m. for constructing the Metal Superstructure of the Thoroughfare Bridge, Parish of Sheffield, Sunbury County, N. B., embracing one through riveted flexed span of 125 ft., in the clear, and one through riveted steel truss swing span of 144 ft., 7 inches in the clear between top front batter walls of the end abutments, according to Plans and Specifications to be seen at the Public Works Department, Fredericton, N. B.

Each tender must be accompanied by a certified bank cheque made payable to the Provincial Secretary Treasurer or Cash for an amount equal to five per cent of the total amount of the tender, which will be forfeited if the party tendering declines to enter into contract when called upon. Such certified bank cheque or cash will be returned to the parties whose tenders are not accepted, but with the party to whom the contract is awarded, it shall be retained until the final completion of the contract and its acceptance by the Department.
