"OLANDS BREWERY, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and Amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Sixteenth day of May, A. D. 1924, incorporating George W. C. Oland, Brewer; George B. Oland, Brewer; both of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; and Beverley R. Armstrong, Barrister; of Rothesay, in the County of King's and Province aforesaid; for the following purposes, namely:
