HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

RULES AND PRACTICE OF THE LEG-ISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

The attention of parties intending to seek legislation at the next session of the Legisative Assembly is directed to the following Rules:

Private and Local Bills

77. A typewritten copy or printed copy of every Private Bill or Local Bill introduced into this House shall be filed with the Clerk of the House within ten days after the opening of the Session, and in case of failure to comply with this provision, the fee on the introduction of any such Private Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule 84, applicable to such Bill, and Local Bills introduced after ten days of the opening of the Session shall pay the same fee as a Private Bill.

No Private Bill, or Bill making an amendment of a like nature to a for-mer Act, shall be received by the House unless a notice specifying clearly and distinctly the nature and objects thereof, has been published four successive weeks previous to the meeting of the Legislature, or to the introduction of the Bill in some one of the newspapers published in the County, interested in or to be affected by the measure, or in the locality where the parties affected, or the majority of them reside; and when no newspaper is published in such county or lo-cality, then in some newspaper having general circulation in such County or locality, and also in the Royal Gazette. When the City or County interested in the measure, or the locality in which the parties affected reside, is largely composed of a French population, then such no-tice shall also be published in a French newspaper, if any be published in the Province.

Applications to Parliament for Private Bills should be advertised by a notice published at least once a week for five consecutive weeks in the Canada Gazette and in certain leading newspapers; such notices shall clearly state the nature and objects of the application, and be signed by or for the applicants and give the address of the applicants or their agents.

Application for an act to incorporate a Bank Insurance, Trust or Loan Com-pany or for an Industrial Company not applying for unusual or exclusive powers may be published in the Canada Gazette orly.

Due publication of notice shall be established by statutory declaration sent to the Clerk of the House of Commons endorsed "Private Bill Notice."

79. In any County where no news-paper may be published, the Bill, in lieu of other local publications, may be read
