To manufacture, bottle, sell and dispose of all kinds of jams, preserves, sauces, pickles, jellies, marmalades, more particularly as follows:

To manufacture, sell and dispose of the following jams: strawberry, raspberry, blueberry, gooseberry, blackberry, currant, apple, pineapple, crabapple, peach, pear, plum, cherry and all other lines of jam.

Also the following line of marmalades, orange marmalade, grapefruit marmalade, pineapple marmalade, ginger marmalade, tri-fruit marmalade, conserves and all other kinds and descriptions of marmalades.

Also to manufacture, bottle, sell and dispose of all kinds of pickles, ketchups, sauces and jellies.

To manufacture, can, sell and dispose of all fruits and vegetables.

To take or hold mortgages for any unpaid account or accounts due or accruing due to said Company.

To mortgage, sell, hypothecate the real estate or personal property of the said Company for the purposes of the said Company.

To purchase, take on, lease or exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real estate, leasehold or personal property and any rights and privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business, and in particular any machinery, plant or stock-in-trade.

To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

The Directors of the said Company may make bye-laws for the control and management of the said Company, by the name of "Thos. E.
