NOTICE TO FUR BUYERS AND OTHERS

Crown Land Office,
August 20th, 1924.

The following regulations have been passed by Order-in-Council, July 8th, 1924:

All persons desiring to export undressed furs outside of the Province or to any fur dresser within the province, shall first obtain a permit called Export or Fur Dressers Permit, the form of which shall be determined by the Minister of Lands and Mines, and which shall be issued by him or by any officer of his department, duly authorized, after an inspection of such furs has been made by one or more of such officers duly authorized for that purpose.

All persons who so desire to ship such furs shall make a written request on forms prepared and supplied by the said Department, upon which there will be indicated clearly the number and kind of skins, the place where they originated the number that are stamped and if they originated outside of the Province, an affidavit from the officer of the province where they originated must be produced.

Any person failing to comply with this regulation will be liable to a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and not more than One Hundred Dollars

(\$100.00), or to imprisonment in any common gaol of the Province for not less than thirty days and not more than sixty days for each offence and the furs so shipped shall be confiscated and sold by the Department of Lands and Mines.

Licenses to expire on the first of August, 1925, but subject to renewal to 1st August 1933, in accordance with Chapter XI, 3 George V., 1913, for Saw Mill Licenses of the following applications for Timber Berths, for the purpose of cutting all classes of lumber, will be sold at this office on Thursday the 25th day of September, 1924, at noon.

Upset price \$20 per square mile in addition to stumpage.

There is no payment of any bonus required. Licenses are renewable each year by payment of \$5 per square mile.
