PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-first day of May, A.
