#### JUDICATURE ACT, 1909. Rules of Court.

This is to certify, pursuant to Section 50 of "The Judicature Act, 1909", the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, by Order-in-Council passed on the Fourth day of March, A. D. 1924, and upon recommendation of all the Judges of the Supreme Court, made the following Rules of Court in amendment and in addition to existing Rules under the said Act.

"Rule 8 of Order 58 of 'The Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909', as enacted by section 4 of Chapter 38 of the Acts of 1914, 'An Act to amend the Judicature Act', and Acts in amendment thereof, is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted in place thereof:

8. When, from any verdict entered, or judgment, finding or Order made or found in the Chancery Division, King's Bench Division Divorce, Probate or County Court, an appeal from such judgment, finding or order be taken, or motion for a new trial, or motion to set aside such verdict, judgment, finding or order, is made, the appellant, or party moving, and the respondent, or party showing cause, shall deposit with the Registrar, for the use of the Court or its Officers, one copy of the notice of motion or appeal and five copies of a factum, such copies to be printed or plainly typewritten, to the satisfaction of the Registrar; and each party so depositing such factum shall serve a copy of the same on the opposite party, or his solicitor. Such factum shall be deposited and served by the appellant, or party moving, fifteen days before the session of the Court at which the appeal is to be heard or motion made, and by the respondent, or party showing cause, seven days before such Session. And if the copies of the factum of the appellant, or party moving, shall not have been filed in any cause or matter as by this Rule required, then the Registrar shall not enter on the docket such cause or matter, unless by order of the Court or a Judge thereof.

Rule 2 of Order LX (a) of the said rules is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted in place thereof:

2. All entries upon the Docket for any Session of the Appeal Division shall be made not later than five days preceding such Session, and the Docket shall be printed forthwith by the Registrar for distribution; and no entry shall be made afterwards, without leave of the Court or a Judge thereof, for good cause shown.
