All persons who so desire to ship such furs shall make a written request on forms prepared and supplied by the said Department, upon which there will be indicated clearly the number and kind of skins, the place where they originated the number that are stamped and if they originated outside of the Province, an affidavit from the officer of the province where they originated must be produced.

Any person failing to comply with this regulation will be liable to a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.60) and not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or to imprisonment in any common gaol of the Province for not than thirty days and not more than sixty days for each offence and the furn co the Department of Lands and Mines.
