Letters Patent Granted

"THE DAVIS PACKING CO., LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act 1906", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twentieth day of November, A. D. 1924, incorporating William Manford Davis, Manufacturer; James Isaac Davis, Manufacturer; and Olivia May Davis, Married Woman; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over the business formerly and at present being car-

ried on by William Manford Davis under the name and style "The Davis Packing Co.", together with the lands and buildings thereon and now owned by the said William Manford Davis, and used in connection with the said business, and all and any of the goods, merchandise, stock-in-trade, and all personal property, plant, machinery and delivery equipment owned or used in connection with the said business, together with the goodwill thereof, and all the rights and contracts in connection with or held by the said William Manford Davis, doing business as aforesaid, subject to any and all liens on said real or personal property.

To acquire by purchase and conveyance, lease or otherwise all such lands, buildings or real estate, works, machinery, plant equipment and appliances as might be necessary or deemed advisable for the purposes of the company and the carrying out of its objects.

To take or otherwise acquire and hold shares in any other company having objects all together or in part similar to those of the Company, or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as to directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property or liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which the Company is authorized to carry on or possess of property suitable for the purposes of the Company.

To enter into partnership or into any arrangements for the sharing of profits, union of interests, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any person or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which the Company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company, and to lend money to, guarantee the contracts of, or otherwise assist any such person or company, and to take or otherwise acquire shares and securities of any such company, and to sell, hold, reissue, with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with the same.

To sell, mortgage or dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.

To carry on the business of packers of meats, canners, bacon factors, salesmen, cheese mongers, poulterers and general provision merchants, and in particular to buy, sell, purchase and deal in goods, stores and consumable articles of all kinds, both wholesale and retail.

To transact every kind of agency business, and generally to engage in any business or transaction which may seem to the Company directly or indirectly conducive to its interests.
