SCALERS' EXAMINATIONS

In accordance with the provisions of the New Brunswick Scalers' Act, C. 30, 12 George V, 1922, all scalers who scale logs on Crown Lands whether employed by licensees or by the Crown must qualify before a Board of Examiners. This includes all scalers holding special Scaler's Permits which expire on July 1st, 1924 and are not renewable. The Act does not apply to scalers on Private Lands.

Regular Examinations will be held at Fredericton at the Crown Land office at 9 a.m. on the second Wednesday in July and the second Wednesday in September 1924.

Applicants must be British subjects, must be over 22 years of age and must have at least two seasons experience in scaling logs. Three letters of recommendation certifying as to the applicants' experience and integrity must accompany each application. The examination fee is \$5.00, which may be paid at the time of examination. Applicants who have already tried the examination and paid the fee will be re-examined free of charge. Applicants must notify the Department of Lands and Mines at least five days previous to the date of examination.
