PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916", and amending Acts Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Second day of January, 1924, incorporating Eugene Connolly, Accountant, Edward Creamer, Mill Foreman; and Nellie Creamer, Stenographer; all of the Town of Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over by purchase or otherwise as a going concern the logging, lumber manufacturing and general trading and other business now and heretofore carried on by The Sinclair Lumber Company at Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick, including its lands, leases, licenses, mill property, mill machinery, logs, lumber, manufactured and unmanufactured, logging contracts, merchandise, supplies and generally all its assets, rights and credit used in connection with its loggings and lumber manufacturing business now and heretofore carried on by it at Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick, but not otherwise, and to carry on the same or any part thereof, and to take over the liabilities of said business.
