

Henry Harrison, Barrister-at-Law, both of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, take over or otherwise acquire as a going concern the whole or any part of the business now carried on at the City of Saint John in the Province of New Brunswick by H. W. The Preference Stock shall be entitled to dividends out of the earnings of the Company determined and declared as dividends in each fiscal year up to but not exceeding Seven Per Centum Per Annum before any dividend shall be set apart or paid on the Common Stock; but such dividends upon the Preference Stock shall not be cumulative and the Preference Stock shall not be entitled to participate in any other or additional earnings or profits. Such Preference stock may be retired or reduced by the Company on any dividend date, such retiring or redemption to be at Par plus a premium of Five Dollars upon each of the said Preference Shares of Stock. In case of liquidation or dissolution of the Company the holders of Preference Stock shall be entitled to receive cash to the amount of their Preference Stock at Par before any payment in liquidation is made upon the Common Stock, and shall not thereafter participate in any of the property of the Company or proceeds of liquidation, with the head office at Westfield in the County of Kings, and Province of New Brunswick.

To carry on and conduct the business of a ship owner in all its branches, namely, chartering, hiring, equipping, loading on commission, or otherwise, using, repairing, renting, or letting out on hire and trading with any ship or ships, vessel or vessels.

To employ as ship's husband and managing agent of and for any ship or ships, vessel or vessels, any person, firm or company, whether limited or

not, and that although he or they may not be entitled to any share or interest in any ship or ships, vessel or vessels or in the Company.

To effect all such insurance in relation to the carrying on of the Company's business and any risks incidental thereto as may seem expedient, and, if thought fit, to subscribe to any association, institution or company calculated to benefit the Company, or persons employed by the Company, or persons having dealings with the Company.
