## Letters Patent Granted

"STONE-AGE CHEMICAL COMPANY" LIMITED.

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies" Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of

the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Fifth day of June, A. D. 1924, incorporating Frank E. Jonah, trainman; Eloise M. Anderson, stenographer; and R. Dwight Mitton, barrister-at-law; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmoreland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To import, manufacture, distill, methylate, buy, sell or deal in chemicals, spirits, explosives and other products whether simple or combined with other substances.

To purchase, take on lease or otherwise acquire (either with or without the surface) any coal, iron or other mineral lands, mining grounds or minerals and any mining rights, grants, concessions or easements and any lands and hereditaments or other property necessary for the advantageous possession or use of the mines or work of the Company or any interest or concession respectively and to search for, get, win, equip, burn, make merchantable, purchase, sell, dispose of or otherwise deal with coal, ores, metals, minerals, or any substances of the earth.

To import, purchase, acquire, sell, smelt, concentrate, quarry, reduce, distill, methylate, trade, extract, refine or produce in any manner whatsoever by any process whatever and deal in any vegetable, mineral, animal, wood, metallic, iron, chemical, medicinal, liquid or other substance or product.

To manufacture, buy and sell medicinal preparations and generally carry on wholesale and retail business as manufacturers, buyers, and vendors of all kinds of medicines and chemicals, compounded articles, scientific parties, surgical instruments and supplies.

To carry on the trade of chemist, druggist, apothecary and traders, merchants and manufacturers of medical and pharmaceutical preparations.

To acquire and take over from the said Frank E. Jonah certain rights to extract materials used in the preparation of "Stone-Age Remedy" from shale deposits on Indian Mountain in the Parish of Moncton in the County of Westmoreland aforesaid for which the said Frank E. Jonah is the holder of certain mining rights and to pay for the same in paid-up shares of the Capital Stock of the Company.

To acquire and take over from the said Frank E.
