Licenses to expire on the First of August 1924 but subject to renewal to 1st August 1925, in accordance with Chapter 11, 2 George V., 1913, for Saw Mill Licenses of the following applications for timber Berths for the purpose of cutting all classes of lumber, will be sold at this office on Thursday the 31st day of January 1924 at noon.

Upset price \$20 per square mile in addition to stumpage.

There is no payment of any bonus required. Licenses are renewable each year by payment of \$5 per square mile and fire tax of \$2.50 per square mile. Stumpage in accordance with the regulations in force and subject to annual change.

All timber, logs, or other lumber cut upon unlicensed Crown Land, or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no timber or lumber shall be cut on any berth applied for until it shall be purchased at public auction.

"THE CHAPEL GROVE COUNTRY CLUB, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Seventh day of January, A. D. 1924, incorporating Edward S. C. Hansen, Insurance Manager; Urban A. Ballard, Clerk; and Walter P. Evans, Merchant; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To promote, organize, conduct and manage, golf, athletic country and social clubs, and to promote the welfare of the members thereof.

To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise, farm lands, lots and generally real estate of any description or any interest or rights therein and to take, build upon, hold, own, maintain, work, develop, lease and exchange or otherwise deal in and dispose of such lots, lands, real estate, and any interest therein.

To adopt a constitution and bye-laws rules and regulations for the admission and expulsion of the members of any golf, country or social clubs promoted, organized, conducted or managed by the Company, and for the government of said members and for the establishment of different classes of membership, for the collection of fees and dues, for the election and appointment of Directors and Officers, and to define their duties and for the safe keeping and protection of its property and funds, and in general to regulate and manage and to preserve its property and interests, and from time to time to alter, repeal, rescind or vary any such constitution, bye-laws or regulations or any of them.

D. 1924, incorporating Max Marcus, Merchant; Hyman Louis Marcus, Merchant; and Jean Diamond Marcus, Married Woman; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in furniture boxes, metal, metal work, plated ware articles made in whole or in part of wood, metal or paper, castings, dies and fittings, furnishings and supplies for offices, vaults, schools, churches, halls, theatres and other public and private buildings and to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in the raw materials required by the Company or any of them and in connection with the above mentioned objects.
