

qualified medical practitioners to attend and treat any employees or other occupant of such camp affected with a notifiable disease, and to take such other measures as the Minister may deem proper and necessary in connection with such sickness.

#### First Aid.

171. The Minister may further direct the owner or manager of such camp to provide such camp with suitable dressings and remedies as the Minister may deem useful or necessary in the matter of "first aid" to the sick or injured of the occupants of such camp and to constantly maintain such dressings and remedies in proper order and amount.

#### First-aid Room.

172. The owner or manager of any camp upon its erection must erect and maintain a proper and separate room or building for the accommodation of any occupant of such camp as may become injured or sick of any disease, until such occupant be properly transferred to some hospital or other proper place, and such separate room or building shall conform in all particulars to these regulations relating to camps, so far as its sanitary condition is concerned, except as regards cubic space, which shall not be less than 600 cubic feet per occupant.

#### Sanitary convenience for temporary camps.

172a. In all camps temporary as to location such as railroad and road construction camps, stream-driving and booming camps and others of like transient nature, wherein the occupants number twenty or more, whether in a single building or a group of buildings, proper provision shall be made, by the owner or manager, for sanitary conveniences in the form of earth closets, open-air latrines or other like arrangements satisfactory as to nature, location and usage to the Medical Health Officer of the Health District in which such camp is situated.

These regulations from number 155 to 172a inclusive relate to camps only.
