## DEPT. OF HEALTH

## BY-LAW

LAW GOVERNING THE SALE OF MILK OR CREAM IN THE CITY OF MONCTON OR ANY AND ALL TOWNS OR CITIES WITHIN THE SUB-DISTRICT OF WESTMORLAND COUNTY.

Be it enacted that the fee for a License or permit to sell milk or cream in the City of Moncton or any Town or City in the Sub-District of Westmorland County in accordance with Section 55 of the regulations of the Minister of Health shall be one dollar per annum for each calendar year in which the License is issued.
