Whereas, it hath pleased Almighty God in His Great Goodness to vouchsafe this

year unto Our Dominion of Canada, a bountiful harvest and other blessings:—We therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint and We do appoint Monday, the tenth day of November next (Armistice Day), as a day of general thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year and We invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of general thanksgiving.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness: The Honourable Francis Alexander Anglin, Chief Justice of Canada, and Deputy of Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Julian Hedworth George, Baron Byng of Vimy, General on the Retired List and in the Reserve of Officers of Our Army; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Member of Our Royal Victorian Order, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this sixteenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and in the fifteenth year of Our Reign.
