PROVINCE OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

Having received a certified copy of a By-law passed by the Village of Port Elgin, a village duly incorporated under the provisions of Chapter 54 of the Acts of Assembly, 18 George V., 1920, "The Villages Incorporation Act", which said By-law reads as follows:—

"By-Law No. 31. Ordered that twenty-five year coupon bearing bonds, bearing interest at five and one-half per centum per annum, be issued, and sold by the Village of Port Elgin, N. B., to the amount of Six Thousand Dollars, and that the money realized from such issue and sale be used to complete electric light plant for said Village."

And having also received a certified copy of the Notice provided for in Section 142 of the said Act and a statutory declaration proving the posting of such Notice and that a poll has not been demanded and also showing the total of assessable real property in the Village as shown by the last revised assessment roll thereof:

And I being satisfied that the several conditions required by the said Act, have been substantially complied with, I do hereby authorize the Council of the said Village to borrow by way of Debentures, the sum of money mentioned in the said By-Law to be used for the purpose mentioned in said By-law.
