## Letters Patent Granted

"O'CONNOR MANUFACTURING COMPANY, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Thirtieth day of July, A. D. 1925, whereby three hundred and thirty shares of the Capital Stock of the Company of the aggregate par value of Thirty-three thousand dollars are converted from Common shares to preferred shares bearing a first fixed cumulative dividend of Seven per centum per annum payable half-yearly.

The said shares to be issued and allotted by the Directors of the Company as they may direct, and the parties to whom the same shall respectively be issued and allotted and any subsequent holders thereof shall be entitled to receive the said dividends and shall hold the said Shares upon the terms following:

Th said Preference Shares shall confer on the holder the right to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of seven per centum on the capital paid up thereon.

After the payment to the holders of the said Preference Shares of the said first fixed cumulative dividends of Seven Per Centum Per Annum as aforesaid, they shall not be entitled to any further dividend or to participate further in the profits of the Company.

The holders of the said Preference Shares shall in a winding up have priority as to return of capital and pay-

ment of all arrears of dividend whether declared or not to the commencement of the said winding up over all other shares of the capital for the time being of the Company, and shall not be entitled in such winding up to participate in the surplus assets of the Company.

Nothing herein contained shall oblige the Directors of the Company to declare any dividend in any particular year, or interfere with any discretion exercisable by them respecting payment of dividends and no interest shall be payable on any dividend on Preference Shares unless and until such dividend has been declared.

The said Preference Shares shall confer on the holder thereof no right to vote unless and until the Company shall make default in the payment of two annual dividends, whereupon the holders of said Preference Shares shall have the same right to vote as the owners of the Common Shares, and such right to vote shall continue until all arrears of dividends are paid, and so from time to time as often as the case shall happen.
