Letters Patent Granted

"MAIN GARAGE COMPANY LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the 17th day of August, A. D. 1925 incorporating Lloyd C. Ryan, Garage Manager; C. Evelyn Walsh, Book-keeper; and Kenneth J. MacRae, Barrister-at-

Law; all of the city of Saint John in the County of the City and County of Saint John and province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes namely:

To acquire from the said Lloyd C. Ryan the business now carried on by him as a dealer in automobiles and automobile accessories equipment and appliances and as a repairer of automobiles including all the assets rights and credits of the said business and the good will thereof.

To buy, sell, trade in and carry on the business of dealers in automobiles, cycles, bicycles, tricycles, motors, engines, carriages, aeroplanes, hydroplanes and conveyances of all kinds and in all articles used in the construction thereof and all fuels, lubricants, accessories, tools equipment and appliances used in connection therewith.

To carry on the business of machinists.

To apply for, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire any patents, licenses, concessions or the like conferring exclusive or limited right to use any invention which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the company and to use, exercise, lease, sell or grant licenses in respect thereof or otherwise turn to account the property or rights so to be acquired.
