Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-fourth day of October, A. D. 1925, incorporating James Burgess, Lumberman; Albyn Burgess, Lumberman; and Frank D. Burgess, Lumberman; all of Grand Falls, in the County of Victoria, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on in all its branches a lumber, timber and pulpwood business and to cut, manufacture, produce, buy, sell and deal in logs, lumber and wood of all kinds, and to manufacture such wood, timber, logs and lumber into any article or articles of which the same may form a part.

To purchase, sell or otherwise acquire real estate, lands, timber limits, water lots, river lots, franchises, privileges, easements and licenses of all kinds, and to sell, dispose of, mortgage, exchange or otherwise deal in and with the same.

To improve and develop rivers and lakes and to construct and maintain reservoirs, dams, embankments, booms and other works and equipments of all kinds.
