By His Honour William F. Todd, LL. D., Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick.



WILLIAM F. TODD

Whereas, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday, the Sixth day of August next, I have thought fit to dissolve the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby dissolved accordingly.

And I have thought fit further to order and direct that Writs for calling a new Legislative Assembly, to meet on the Tenth day of September next, be forthwith issued in due form, returnable forthwith to our Provincial Secretary-Treasurer at Fredericton.
