By His Honour William F. Todd, LL. D., Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick.

Whereas, Writs for a Legislative Assembly were issued on the Seventeenth day of July last, returnable forthwith, and the Legislative Assembly was therein called to meet on the Tenth day of September instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the Fifth day of November next.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the 30th day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty five, and in the Sixteenth year of His Majesty's Reign.

Whereas it hath pleased Almighty God in His great goodness to vouchsafe this year unto Our Dominion of Canada a bountiful harvest and other blessings.

We therefore considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgement have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada to appoint, and We do appoint Monday the ninth day of November next (Armistice Day) as a day of general thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; And We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as the day of general thanksgiving.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness: Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Julian Hedworth George, Baron Byng of Vimy,

General on the Retired List and in the Reserve of Officers of Our Army, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Member of Our Royal Victorian Order, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this seventh day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and in the sixteenth year of Our Reign.
