Letters Patent Granted

To equip and conduct a Sanitarium for the treatment of non-contagious diseases.

THE HONOURABLE THE ACTING MINISTER OF LANDS AND MINES REPORTS FOR THE INFORMATION OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL:

That by an order-in-council passed on the third day of March, 1925, the following regulation made under the provisions of Section 92 of the Game Act, 1921, was approved and adopted:

"All persons desiring to export live fur bearing animals from New Brunswick to points outside the Province shall first obtain a permit as required under subsection (2) of Section 22 of the Game Act which shall be issued by the Minister of Lands and Mines or by any officer duly authorized by him upon written application showing place of shipment, shipper's name, destination, and the number and kind of live fur bearing animals and upon payment of \$1.00 for each animal. Any person failing to comply with this regulation will be liable to a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00, or to imprisonment in any common goal for not less than thirty days and not more than sixty days for each offence and the live fur bearing animals so shipped shall be confiscated and sold by the Department of Lands and Mines. The above regulation to become effective on April 1st, 1925, upon publication in the Royal Gazette."

The Honourable the Acting Minister of Lands and Mines now recommends that the said Regulation be amended by adding thereto the following:

This Regulation shall not apply to the export of live fur bearing animals reared in captivity in the Province of New Brunswick.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation.

It is accordingly so ordered.
