Letters Patent Granted

"MAINE-CANADIAN PULPWOOD, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Fifth day of March, A. D. 1925, incorporating Pearl T. Smith, Stenographer; C. Robert Hawkins, Barrister-at-Law; and Charles T. Harrison, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on in the Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere, the business of lumbering and lumber trade in all its branches, and all other business incidental thereto, including buying, selling, and dealing in all kinds of sawed, squared and hewed lumber, and timber, saw logs, ties, piling, telegraph and telephone poles, fence posts, wood and all other products of the forest.

To carry on in all its branches the business of a manufacturer and dealer in logs, lumber, timber, pulp, pulpwood, paper and other products or by-products of wood and all other articles and materials into which wood, pulp, pulp board or paper enter or form part, and to carry on the business of general manufacturers and millers, and to establish shops or stores, and to purchase, sell and deal in general merchandise.

To manufacture, buy, sell, and deal in peat, wood and alcohol, calcium carbide, and all kinds of chemicals, and to purchase, erect or otherwise acquire such factories and works as may be deemed necessary for such purpose.

To purchase, lease, acquire and to have and to hold and dispose of real and personal property of all kinds.

To possess and exercise all and any of the powers mentioned and set forth in Section 14 of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", as amended by Section E of Chapter 35 of the Acts of Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, passed in the year 1915, by the name of "Maine-Canadian Pulpwood, Limited", with a Capital Stock of Twenty four thousand dollars divided into two hundred and forty shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head Office at the Town of Saint Stephen in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick.
