### ASSEMBLY CHAMBER

FREDERICTON, THURSDAY, MARCH 12, 1925.

This being the day appointed by Proclamation for the meeting of the Legislature, at three o'clock His Honour, William Frederic Todd, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Assembly Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, was pleased to open the Session with the following:

## SPEECH

*MR. SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY,*

It is with pleasure that I welcome you on assembling once more for the discharge of your very important legislative duties.

The year just passed, has, I am pleased to say, given evidence of a continued, though somewhat slow, return to normal conditions so seriously disturbed by the after effects of the World War. Our Province continues to enjoy peace and good
