"SMALLWOOD & STEARS, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Second day of March, A. D. 1925, incorporating Clarke Wallace Smallwood, Druggist, Ernest LeBaron Stears, Druggist; Christina Elizabeth Smallwood, wife of the said Clarke Wallace Smallwood; and Sadie Venables Stears, wife of the said Ernest LeBaron Stears; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes namely:

To purchase, take over or otherwise acquire and continue as a going concern, the business now being carried on at the City of Moncton in the Province of New Brunswick, of Clarke Wallace Smallwood and Ernest LeBaron Stears, doing business under the firm name and style of Smallwood & Stears, and all or any of the assets and liabilities of the proprietors of that business in connection therewith, with the undertaking and goodwill thereof, and all rights and contracts now held by the Proprietors subject to the obligations, if any, affecting the same, and to pay for the same in paid-up shares of this Company, or in such other manner whatsoever as may be agreed upon.

To carry on the business of retail and wholesale chemists and druggists in all its branches.

To produce, manufacture, purchase, sell, import, export, or otherwise acquire, deal in and deal with, utilize and dispose of,

either as wholesale or retail, drugs and medicines of all kinds, physicians', hospital and sick room supplies, wines, liquors, and all other alcoholic products, soaps, perfumes, toilet articles and fancy goods, snuff, leaf tobacco, cigars, cheroots, cigarettes, and all other forms of tobacco, proprietary articles and druggists' sundries, petroleum and all other mineral, animal or vegetable oils, chemicals of every character, chemical, electrical, surgical and scientific apparatus and equipment, rubber, rubber goods and all articles containing rubber in any form, crockery, china, pottery, glassware, metalware and hardware, paper, bagging, bags, boxes, cases, cans, jars, and other receptacles and materials from which the same are or may be made and their ingredients.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, acquire, hold, mortgage, sell, lease, convey or otherwise dispose of, any real or personal property, and any rights or interests therein which the Company may think useful or convenient for its purposes.

To distribute the whole or any part of the property or assets of the Company in specie or money among its shareholders, provided, however, that no such distribution shall effect a reduction of the capital of the Company, except made in accordance with "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916".

To pay all costs, charges, expenses, incurred or sustained in or about the promotion or establishment of the Company, or which the Company shall consider preliminary.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

The powers in each paragraph hereof, shall be in nowise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other paragraph, by the name of "Smallwood & Stears, Limited", with a capital stock of Forty-nine thousand dollars divided into four hundred and ninety shares of one hundred dollars each with the head office at the city of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.

"MONCTON KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twentieth day of January, A. NOTICE OF LEGISLATION
