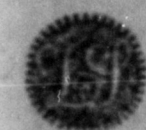

By His Honour William F. Todd, LL. D., Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick.

Whereas, Writs for a Legislative Assembly were issued on the Seventeenth day of July last, returnable forthwith, and the Legislative Assembly was therein called to meet on the Tenth day of September instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the Third day of December next.

Letters Patent Granted

"CANADA-CUBA LINE, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Seventeenth day of November, A. D. 1925, incorporating Cyrus Fiske Inches, Barrister-at-Law; Edward Colpitts Weyman, Barrister-at-Law; and Douglas King Hazen, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint

John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To construct, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, charter, own, maintain, operate and manage steamships, vessels, tow boats, dredges, lighters, barges, boats and water craft of every description.

To take or otherwise acquire and hold, shares in any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as to directly or indirectly benefit the Company.

To sell or dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

The operations of the Company are to be carried on in the Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere, by the name of "Canada-Cuba Line, Limited", with a capital stock of three hundred thousand dollars divided into three thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office in the Parish of Westfield, in the County of Kings and Province of New Brunswick, with permission to hold the annual meetings of the Company without the Province and also special meetings of the Shareholders and meetings of the Directors without the Province.
