### "RAE FRASER, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and Amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twelfth day of March, A. D. 1925, incorporating Roy Philip Raeburn Fraser, Florist; Juanita B. Fraser, wife of the said Roy Philip Raeburn Fraser; both of the Parish of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; and Iris Branscombe, Store Clerk; of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of wholesale and retail dealers in flowers, mosses, ferns, seeds, evergreens and general nursery stock.
