

transporting, towing, lightering, truckage, warehousing, storage, wharfing, elevator, agency, forwarding and carrier company and for said purposes and purposes of a like or similar nature to own and operate docks, warehouses, elevators, conveyors, terminal facilities, car steamers, tugs, vessels, boats and lighters and in connection therewith to buy, sell, handle, saw, cut, mine, trade and deal in and with coal, wood and other fuel and other goods, wares and merchandise.
