"BRAGER BROTHERS, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Eighteenth day of May, A. D. 1925, incorporating Jacob N. Brager, Merchant; and Louis A. Brager, Merchant; and Annie Brager, Married Wo-

man; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over as a going concern the undertaking and business of "Brager Brothers, Limited" a company duly incorporated under the first part of Chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, known as the Companies' Act and amending Acts, with a view to acquire all or any of the assets and liabilities of that Company and to pay for the same in paid-up shares of this Company.

To carry on the business of altering, decorating, furnishing, fitting out and improving dwellings, offices and other buildings of every description.

To carry on the trade and business of importers, exporters, manufacturers of, wholesale and retail dealers and jobbers in hats, caps, head costumes and all materials whether raw or partly manufactured or otherwise that may be used in connection therewith; furs, garments and wearing apparel of every description.

To carry on all or any of the business of hatters, head costumers, clothiers, furriers, tailors, drapers, haberdashers, hosiers, milliners, gloves, manufacturers, importers and wholesale and retail dealers in cotton, silk and textile fabrics of all kinds, furs and dress trimmings, braids, cords, ornaments, laces, buttons novelties and leather goods.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.
