NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

Notice is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at the next session thereof, for the passing of an

Act incorporating Peter J. Hughes, S. W. Staples, and Jean Merrithew, and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed company, a body politic and corporate by the name of Nepisquit Railway Company, with a capital stock of one million dollars, divided into ten thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, for the purpose of and with power to build, equip and operate a railway, to be operated by steam or electric power, from a point on the line of the Northern New Brunswick and Seaboard Railway at or near Austin Brook, Gloucester County, and thence following the valley of the Nepisquit River and or its tributaries to a point near forty mile brook, so called, a branch of said river, and thence continuing westwardly to a point at or near Plaster Rock in Victoria County along such courses as may be located by its engineers, considered most suitable for the requirements of the railway, primarily as a means for transportation of hardwood lumber growing along and adjacent to the proposed railway but with all additional rights, powers, privileges and authorities given to railways and subject to all liabilities imposed thereon by Chapter 91 Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1902, and amending Acts, with the right to build portions of the railway from time to time as may be required by the business of logging hardwood on said lands. And, in addition to aforesaid powers, the right to build and maintain, for its own use, along said railway, telegraph, telephone and electric power lines, and to operate the same, and to acquire such of the public lands of the Province as may be necessary for the proposed railway right of way, upon such terms and conditions as the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, may impose and require.
