

every \$1,000 of capital with a maximum fee of 250.00
 For filing return from a company having shares without nominal or par value, the fee payable shall be calculated upon the assets of such company employed as capital which shall be shown in such return.
 For filing return from a company incorporated for mutual insurance purposes \$5.00
 Note: The above schedule applies to extra-provincial, Dominion and Domestic corporations.

EXCEPTIONS:

Provided, however, that with respect to a Dominion Corporation or to a Foreign Corporation having a nominal capital exceeding \$500,000 and carrying on business in New Brunswick heretofore, and carrying on also an established business outside of New Brunswick in which at least fifty per cent of its subscribed capital is invested, the Governor-in-Council may reduce the annual registration fee payable under this section to such sum as he may think just, having regard to the nature and importance of its business in New Brunswick and the amount of capital used therein; provided also that with respect to such corporation not carrying on business in New Brunswick heretofore when making return under this Act the Governor-in-Council may reduce the annual return fee to such sum as he may think just, having regard to the nature and importance of the business proposed to be carried on in New Brunswick and the amount of capital proposed to be used therein. A corporation seeking a reduction of the fee under this section shall give to the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer such statement and information respecting its business and financial position as he may call for and shall verify the same in such manner as he may require.
