Ellis, Journalist; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, take over and otherwise acquire from F. B. Ellis the job printing business formerly owned by The Saint John Globe Publishing Company, Limited, and carried on by him in the City of Saint John aforesaid.

To print and publish newspapers, magazines, journals, books and publications of a similar nature.

To carry on the business of printers, publishers, stationers, advertising agents, etc.

To carry on a general publishing and job printing business, and any business or undertaking similar or analogous to the foregoing, or any of them, or connected therewith.

To purchase, rent, lease or otherwise acquire any lands, buildings, easements or property, real or personal, which may be requisite for the purposes of, or capable of being conveniently used in connection with any of the objects of the said Company.

To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

To acquire and hold shares, debentures and other securities in other companies when a majority of the Directors of the proposed company shall deem it advisable.
