Whereas it hath pleased Almighty God in His great goodness to vouchsafe this year to Our Dominion of Canada a bountiful harvest and other blessings. We therefore considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgement have thought fit by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada to appoint and We do appoint Monday the eighth day of November next (Armistice Day) as the day of general thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year and We enjoin all Our lawful subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of thanksgiving.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused

these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness: Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Counsellor the Right Honorable Francis Alexander Anglin, Chief Justice of Canada and Administrator of the Government of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this First day of October, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventeenth year of Our Reign.
