PROCLAMATION



By His Honour William F. Todd, LL. D., Lleutenant. Governor of the Province. of New Brunswick.

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province convened on Thursday the 11th day of March last, and continued its Sittings until this day, being the 18th day of April Instant, I have thought fit to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prerogued accordingly to Thursday the 15th day of July next.

The Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council under The Theatres, Cinematographs and other Amusements Act is pleased to make the tariff of fees to be paid under-said Act for annual licenses as follows:

LICENSES 1. Every owner, lessee or other occu-pant having possession or control of any theatre shall before any performance is given therein first obtain a license (herein called a theatre license) under these regulations.

Every film exchange and every user exhibitor or operator and every appren-tice to an operator of a cinematograph shall obtain a license under these regula-

Before any cinematograph is used in any performance there shall be ob-tained from the Board of Censors a certificate that such is a certified cinemato-graph under these regulations. Such cer-tificate shall be called a machine certificate.

Every amusement owner having possession or control of any place of amusement shall before an amusement is conducted therein obtain a license un-der these regulations.

5. Every application for a license or certificate under these regulations shall be made to the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer. Before granting such license or certificate, the Board of Censors may make such investigation into the cir-cumstances of the application as may ap-pear necessary, and if satisfied that the applicant is entitled thereto the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer shall, on pay-ment of the fee herein prescribed, issue a license or certificate in the form in the schedule.

6. All licenses or certificates issued under these regulations shall expire on the first day of June in each year, and all annual licenses or certificates issued hereunder shall be in force for one year following date of asue. The fees payable for such licenses or certificates shall be as follows: as follows:

- 1. For every film exchange\$250.00
- For each reel of film, not more than 1,100 feet submitted to the New Brunswick Board of Cen-sors, an additional fee of
- 3. For every additional hundred feet or fraction thereof
- For appeal from the decision of the Board a fee of \$5.00 per reel shall be paid.
- For every cinematograph or moving picture machine used, for machine certificate
- Every owner, lessee or occupant of a theatre, and every owner, user, or exhibitor, of every cin-ematograph shall pay the following fees:
- (a) In all villages and towns with a population not exceeding 1,500.....05 cts. Der seat.

- (b) In all towns over 1,500 population and up to 3,000 10 cts. per seat.
- (c) In all towns over 3,000 population and up to 7,500 15 cts. per seat.
- (d) In all towns or cities over 7,500 popuper seat, 20 cts.
- (e) In all villages, towns or cities where not more than three performances are given in any week one half the fee as set in section (a) to (d) inclusive shall apply.
- (f) Operators of cinematographs shall pay a license fee of\$2.90
- (g) Apprentices 1.00
- (h) All persons other than those who

The Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council under the New Brunswick Companies Act and Acts in amendment thereof is pleased to make the tariff of fees to be paid under section 117.

For filing annual returns under sec-tion 117 of the Companies Act as amend-ed, amendment act 1926, the fee payable upon each return shall be as follows:

Companies with an authorized capital not exceeding \$25,000 \$ 5.00

Companies with exceeding \$50,000, but not exceeding \$100,000 30.06

Companies with an authorized capital exceeding \$100,000, but not exceeding \$250,000 46.00 Companies with an authorized capital exceeding \$250,000, twenty cents for
