For filing return from a company having shares without nominal or par value, the fee payable shall be calculated upon the assets of such company employed as capital which shall be shown in such return.

For filing return from a company incorporated for mutual insurance purposes ..... \$5.00

Note: The above schedule applies to extra-provincial, Dominion and Domestic corporations.

#### EXCEPTIONS:

Provided, however, that with respect to a Dominion Corporation or to a Foreign Corporation having a nominal capital exceeding \$500,000 and carrying on business in New Brunswick heretofore, and carrying on also an established business outside of New Brunswick in which at least fifty per cent of its subscribed capital is invested, the Governor-in-Council may reduce the annual registration fee payable under this section to such sum as he may think just, having regard to the nature and importance of its business in New Brunswick and the amount of capital used therein; provided also that with respect to such corporation not carrying on business in New Brunswick heretofore when making return under this Act the Governor-in-Council may reduce the annual return fee to such sum as he may think just, having regard to the nature and importance of the business proposed to be carried on in New Brunswick and the amount of capital proposed to be used therein. A corporation seeking a reduction of the fee under this section shall give to the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer such statement and information respecting its business and financial position as he may call for and shall verify the same in such manner as he may require.

#### "JACOBSON & COMPANY, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies" Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Second day of June, A. D. 1926, incorporating Harry Jacobson, Merchant; Myer Jacobson, Merchant; and Louis Jacobson, Merchant; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over from the applicant Harry Jacobson, the furniture business at present being carried on at Number 673 Main Street in the said City

of Saint John by the said Harry Jacobson under the name and style of "Jacobson & Co.," including the good-will, right to use the name "Jacobson & Co.," stock, stock-in-trade, book debts, choses in actions, assets, rights and credits, furniture, office fixtures and fittings, books, books of accounts, moneys, securities for money, bills receivable, notes, debts, contracts, claims and demands of the said Harry Jacobson in connection with the said business to the amount of Fifteen Thousand Dollars.

To manufacture, buy and sell leather and leather goods.

To carry on the business of upholsterers in all its branches and the repairing and replacing of upholstery.

To buy, sell, deal in and manufacture crockery, porcelain china pottery, glass decorations, ornaments and all varieties of household furnishings, decorations, utensils and equipment.

To buy, sell and carry on the trade or business of importers, exporters, manufacturers, dealers and jobbers in clothing, fur, dress trimmings, dry goods, silks, satins, woollens, braids, cords, ornaments, buttons, novelties, leather goods, laces and textile fabrics of all kinds.

To purchase, acquire, hold and dispose of shares, stock and securities of any firm or corporation engaged in a similar business, and to pay for the same in cash, stock, bonds, debentures or other securities of the Company.

To acquire and carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, of the same nature and character as this Company is authorized to carry on and capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the business of the Company.
