On the recommendation of W. L. McFarlane, Chief Inspector under the Intoxicating Liquor Act, that the resignation of L. S. Hutchinson of the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland as sub-inspector under the provisions of the Intoxicating Liquor Act, 1916, be accepted, said resignation to date as of March 31, 1926.

On the recommendation of W. L. McFarlane, Chief Inspector under the Intoxicating Liquor Act, 1916, that the prohibition district of the City of Moncton, be sub-divided and sub-inspectors named as follows:

Sub-District No. 1—Taking in Ward 1, with sub-inspectors Douglas Klever and Joseph Bourgeois, the latter to have concurrent jurisdiction in the Parish of Moncton.
