PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-second day of June, A. D. 1926, incorporating Clarence Newcombe Goodspeed, Proprietor of Motor Bus Line; Jennie Douglas Goodspeed, Married Woman; and Lois Clare Goodspeed, Stenographer; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern the business of operating motor buses now carried on and conducted at the City of Fredericton, and vicinity by the said Clarence N. Goodspeed together with all rights and franchises and the good-will thereof, and to carry on the same and pay for the same in paid-up shares of the Company.

To carry on the business of operating omnibuses, cabs, drays, taxi-cabs, motor busses, auto drays, motor trucks or other

private or public conveyances of all kinds where the Company may see fit.

To acquire from any municipality or corporation any franchises or rights to operate omnibuses, motor busses or any other vehicles which could or may be operated for carrying passengers or goods for hire.

To keep, maintain, operate, and manage garages and service stations.

To buy and sell, exchange or otherwise deal in motor cars, motor trucks, taxicabs, motor busses, motor drays, tractors, farming machinery and implements and equipment and other vehicles propelled by any power whatsoever, and their parts and accessories.

To deal in gasoline, steam and electrical power.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, acquire, hold, mortgage, sell, lease, convey or otherwise dispose of any real or personal property or any rights or privileges which the Company may think useful or convenient by the name of "The Devon Bus Company, Limited", with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into fifty shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office at the Town of Devon in the County of York, and Province of New Brunswick.

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-third day of June, A. D. 1926, incorporating John Seaborn McLaughlin, Barrister-at-Law; Gordon McLaughlin, Barrister-at-Law; and Marie Collins, Stenographer; all of the City of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of manufacturers of and dealers in tobacco, cigars, cigarettez, match lights, pipes and any other articles required by or which may be convenient to smokers, and of snuff grinders and meschants and box merchants.

To deal in any other articles and things commonly dealt in by tobaccoists.

To import, export, manufacture, buy, sell and deal in goods, wares and merchandise and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the same shall be deemed to include confectionery, biscuits, candy and all goods of which sugar or flour forms a part; and to act as agents

for the purchase and sale of any such goods, wares and merchandise.

To erect, construct, improve, buy, purchase, take in exchange, take on lease or otherwise acquire and establish, maintain and operate, and hold, own and sell, lease or otherwise dispose of and deal in factories, warehouses, stores, shops, buildings, depots and agencies, adapted to or necessary or essential to the business of the Company.

To carry on any other business which may seem capable of being conveniently or advantageously carried on in connection with the business of the Company or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of, to facilitate the realization of or to render more profitable any of the Company's businesses, properties or rights.

To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person, partnership, association, company or corporation having objects altogether or in part similar to the Company or carrying on any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property which may seem suitable or desirable for the purpose of the Company.

To take or otherwise acquire and hold shares in any partnership or stock or shares in any association, company or corporation carrying on any business which may seem capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To promote, form, organize, manage, develop, take interests or stock or shares in and assist financially or otherwise any partnership, association, company or corporation for the purposes of acquiring or taking over all or any of the property and liabilities of the Company or for any other purpose which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To draw, make, accept, endorse, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To adopt such means of making known the products of the Company as may seem expedient, and in particular by advertising in the press, by circulars, by purchase and exhibition of works of art or interest, by publication of books and periodicals and by granting prizes, rewards and donations.

To consolidate or amalgamate with any other company having objects similar in whole or in part to those of the Company.

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.

To do all such things as may seem directly or indirectly to be incidental to or conducive to or convenient or proper for the accomplishment of the purposes
