PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Twenty-second day of November, A. D. 1926, incorporating Kenneth C. Irving, Merchant; of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; James Dergavel Irving, Merchant; and Mary Elizabeth Irving, Housewife; both of the village of Buctouche, in the County of Kent and Province aforesaid; for the following purposes namely:

To carry on the business of garage-men, machinists and automobile out-fitters.

To act as agents for traders, dealers or manufacturers of any goods, wares or merchandise appertaining to the said business or any part of the business aforesaid.

To take, acquire, hold, sell and dispose of, real estate and personal property of every kind and description as security for or in satisfaction wholly or in part of debts, liabilities, or obligations incurred or to be incurred in respect of or in connection with the business aforesaid or any of the purposes or objects of the Company.

To deal in tractors, marine and stationary engines, lumbering or mill machinery and equipments or any of the accessories, parts or apparatus related thereto.

To act as agents for manufacturers of the aforesaid articles and commodities.

To own and operate tanks, wagons, automobile trucks, boats, steamers or any other means or conveyances for the transportation, storing and sale of gasoline, oils or other similar commodities.

To own and operate automobiles, trucks or wagons necessary to carry on the business of livery-men, automobile salvors or wreckers.

To carry on the business of a transportation company.

To accept the surrender of shares in the capital stock of the said Company and to give credit for any unpaid balance of the purchase price thereof to subscribers and Shareholders and to relieve such Shareholders and subscribers from liability thereon.
