JUDICATURE ACT, 1909

Rules of Court

This is to certify pursuant to Section 53 of "The Judicature Act, 1909," the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council by Order in Council passed on the 4th day of March A. D. 1926, and upon the recommendation of all the judges of the Supreme Court made the following Rules of Court in amendment and in addition to existing Rules under the said Act.

Ordered that Order VI of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, is hereby amended by adding thereto as Rules 1a and 2a of the said order the following:

"1a. A concurrent originating summons may be issued in the same manner

mutatis mutandis as a concurrent writ of summons."

"2a. An originating summons for service within the jurisdiction may be issued and marked as a concurrent originating summons, with one for service out of the jurisdiction; and an originating summons for service out of the jurisdiction may be issued and marked as a concurrent originating summons, with one for service within the jurisdiction."

Notice is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at its next session, for the passing of an Act, incorporating a company to be called "Nepisquit Storage Company Limited," having for its objects, the building and maintaining of storage dams in and upon Nepisquit River and its tributaries and elsewhere adjacent thereto particularly at a point six miles below Nepisquit Lakes, to create storage basins and to keep accumulations of water stored therein for the purpose of and with power to regulate and equalize the flow of water in said river and tributaries at all seasons of the year, with power to charge power com-

panies for the use of the stored water for operation of power plants, and for the vesting in the company by grant or legislation of real estate necessary for the dams, plant and works of the Company, and flowage rights over and upon Nepisquit Lakes, the bed of the river and its tributaries and lands adjacent thereto necessary for such storage of water, and to build and maintain all necessary buildings, sluices, water gates and regulating devices at and in connection with all such dams, and also a telephone line and its equipment connecting the Company's offices and works with users of such stored water, and with power to issue debentures secured by the property of the Company, and such other rights and powers usually given to joint stock Companies, necessary for the carrying out of the objects of the Company.

Notice is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at its next session, for the passing of an Act incorporating a company to be called "Nepisquit Power Company Limited," having for its objects the building, maintaining and operating of a hydro electric power plant, at the Narrows about five miles above Grand Falls on Nepisquit River, together with all necessary dams, sluices, waterways, water gates, generators, turbines, and all other necessary and convenient buildings, structures and equipment therefor, and to generate electrical power therein and to sell the same to Bathurst Company Limited, and any surplus created (in excess of what is required by Bathurst Company Limited) to other consumers of electrical power, and also other similar plants at other points on said river, and with power to purchase or acquire any and all other hydro electric powers and properties now existing or which may hereafter be built or erected upon or adjacent to said river, or the stock or bonds of any company owning the same, and with power to erect, maintain and operate necessary electric transmission lines from the works of the Company to consumers or distributing points, and for the vesting in the company by grant or legislation of real estate necessary for all dams, plant and works of the Company, and flowage rights over and upon all portions of the bed of the Nepisquit River and the lands adjacent thereto for the filling and maintaining of necessary water in said dams, and also a telephone line from the company's works and office to Bathurst or connecting points with other such lines, and with power to issue debentures secured by the property of the Company, and such other rights and powers usually given to joint stock Companies, necessary for the carrying out of the objects of the
