

of the Court, Town Council or Municipal Council, as the case may be; and a petition must be presented to the House setting forth in detail the object of the measure, and the reasons that may be urged for its adoption.

80. When any Bill affects Civil or Municipal interests, a notice distinctly specifying the purposes and objects of the Bill shall, at least one week before the introduction of such Bill into the House, be delivered to the Secretary-Treasurer of the County or to the Clerk of the City or Town which may be affected, and due proof of such notice shall be made by affidavit.

81. It shall be the duty of all parties seeking the interference of the Legislature in any Private Bill, to file with the Clerk of this House the evidence of their having complied with the Rules and Standing Orders thereof.

82. In default of such proof or evidence being so furnished, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to report to Mr. Speaker, or the House, and to indorse upon the Bill that the Rules and Standing Orders have not been complied with.

84. No Private or Local Bills shall be received unless it shall be certified by the Deputy Provincial Treasurer upon the Bill, or by certificate annexed thereto, that there has been received into the Provincial Treasury towards the printing and other contingent expenses of the House, the following:

On all original bills not exceeding one page, \$50.00.

For each additional page or part of a page, \$10.00.

On all amending bills not exceeding one page, \$30.00.

For each additional page or part of a page, \$10.00.

Upon incorporation of Companies having a stated capital, or amendments increasing capital, an additional fee equal to the fee payable under the N. B. Joint Stock Company's Act.

A page, for the purposes of this Rule, shall mean not exceeding 500 words.

Provided, that when a Bill in respect of which such payment has been made, does not pass the Legislature, it may be introduced at the next following Session upon the payment of an additional sum of \$10.00, and

Provided, also, that the Rule shall not extend to Acts for the incorporation or relating to the property or objects of churches, hospitals, public halls or societies for charitable, literary or recreational purposes, whose object is not private gain.

155. Proof of publication of Bills advertised under Rule 78 of the Rules and Practice of this House must be by affidavit or solemn declaration.

To construct, equip, acquire and operate abattoirs, packing, curing and cold storage plants.

To buy, sell and otherwise deal in and advance money on the security of live stock and dressed meats.

To manufacture, prepare, can, cure, buy, sell and deal in meats of all kinds, poultry and farm products.

To carry on business as a meat curer and packer.

To produce, purchase, sell and deal in meats, butter, cheese, eggs, milk, vegetables, poultry, fruit and other food, farm and dairy products, and the materials entering into the production thereof.

To manufacture, lease, purchase and sell all machinery, tools, implements, apparatus and all other articles and appliances used in connection with any or all of the purposes aforesaid or with selling and transporting the manufactured and other products of the Company.

To carry on the refrigerator business and the business of forwarding agents and preservers and packers of provisions of all kinds.

To carry on the business of a cold storage company in all of its branches.

To raise, purchase, sell and otherwise deal in hogs, cattle, sheep, poultry, game, eggs, butter, cheese and all other farm, field, orchard, garden and dairy products.

To conduct slaughter houses to slaughter all kinds of animals, and manufacture, purchase, sell and otherwise deal in meats, fertilizers, fat, tallow and

other substances derived from the said animals.

To carry on the business of pork packing.

To establish and maintain wholesale and retail shops, and generally to carry on any business undertaking which may be conveniently carried on with the above.

To carry on business as merchants, brokers, traders, commission agents, factors, and general agents.

To carry on the business of raising, producing, developing, manufacturing and marketing all products of the soil whether animal or vegetable, and to manufacture and produce any products and by-products thereof.

To buy, sell, raise, slaughter, export, import, and generally deal in pigs, sheep, cattle, poultry, and all kinds of domestic animals.

To carry on a dairy business in all its branches.

To carry on the business of wholesale and retail dealers.

To produce, manufacture, buy, sell, store, import, and generally deal in meat and meat products, poultry and poultry products.

To carry on any other business of a similar nature or any business which may in the opinion of the Directors be conveniently carried on by the Company.

To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise, lands, buildings and hereditaments of any nature or description that are situated in the Province of New Brunswick or elsewhere.

Licenses to expire on the 1st of August, 1926, but subject to renewal to 1st of August, 1927, in accordance with Chapter XL. 1 George V., 1912, for Saw Mill Licenses of the following applications for Timber Berths, for the purpose of cutting all classes of lumber, will be sold at this office on Thursday the 4th day of February 1926 at noon.

Upset price \$20 per square mile in addition to stumpage.

There is no payment of any bonus required. Licenses are renewable each year by payment of \$8 per square mile, and fire tax of \$3.20 per square mile. Stumpage in accordance with the regulations in force and subject to annual change.

All timber, logs, or other lumber cut upon unlicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own berth, shall be seized and
