PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 43 of Chapter 29, 12 Geo. V., 1922, the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "a protected area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

No person may enter upon any forest land after May 1st, 1926 until November 1st, 1926 for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing, or picnicking or for other purposes, without first having registered with a local fire warden, Councilor, game warden, or other person duly authorized, giving his name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip, with dates, and having obtained a registration certificate. Such certificate shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons or companies shall not be subject to the above regulations, namely: Licensees or owners or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or to their employees, or to the fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, or to persons accompanied by registered guides, or to holders of hunting, fishing, guides or mining licenses or leases; or to Clergymen, Teachers, pupils accompanied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts. All persons shall when requested by any fire warden show their license and give the above mentioned information regarding their stay in the forest.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10 and not more than \$100.

DEPT. OF HEALTH

REGULATIONS OF THE SAINT JOHN SUB-DISTRICT BOARD OF HEALTH.

Relating to Persons who undertake for Hire or Reward to Nurse and Maintain Infants under the Age of Seven Years, Apart from Their Parents.

(Under authority of Section 44 of the Public Health Act, 1918 and Amendments thereto 1923.)

20. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires "Infant" means a child of either sex, under the age of seven years.

21. Whenever any person undertakes for hire or reward to nurse and maintain any infant apart from its parents, or having no parents, he shall within 48 hours from the reception of any such infant, give notice in writing thereof to the District Medical Health Officer, provided that this section shall not apply with respect to any infant where the period for which it is received is 48 hours or less.

22. Whenever a person undertakes for hire or reward to nurse and maintain any infant already in his care, without reward the entering into the undertaking shall for the purposes of these regulations be treated as a reception of the infant.

23. The notice required under this Section shall state the name, sex, and date and place of birth of the infant, the name of the person receiving the infant, and dwelling within which the infant is being kept, and the name and address of the parents or the person from whom the infant has been received.

24. If any person who has undertaken the nursing and maintenance of any such infant, changes his residence, he shall, within 48 hours thereof, give to the District Medical Health Officer notice in writing of the change.

25. Any person who has undertaken the nursing and maintenance of any such infant shall keep and maintain a register in which shall be inscribed the name, sex, and date and place of birth of the infant, the name of the person receiving the infant, and the dwelling within which the infant is being kept, and the name and address of the parents or of the person from whom the infant has been received.

26. If any such infant dies or is removed from the care of the person who has
