All condemned material shall be at once removed away entirely from such accepted material and the bridge site generally.

The material throughout to be of the best quality of its respective kind. It shall be of a large, free from sap, growth, straight grained, free from large or loose knots, wane edges, through or round shakes, large or through season cracks, decay, mould, worm holes, or any defects impairing its strength or durability; to be sawed straight and of full and even length, width and thickness.

4" thick black spruce plank, not less than 6 inches in width, and in single lengths of 14 ft., 40,000 F. B. M.

500 running feet of 4" x 6", 1,000 F. B. M.
