To purchase or otherwise acquire any business within the objects of the Company and any lands, property, franchises, privileges, rights, contracts and liabilities appertaining to the same.

To lend or advance money or interest or otherwise to such parties and under such terms as may seem expedient and in particular to customers and persons having dealings with the Company, and to take any security for such advances or for any indebtedness, and to give any guarantee or indemnity that may seem expedient.

To draw, take, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, debentures and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To raise or borrow money for the purposes of the Company or any of them on such terms, in such manner and in such amounts as the Company shall think fit.

To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with, all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

To carry on the business of buying, selling and dealing in goods and merchandise of all kinds and descriptions and the business of commission merchants.

To act as brokers, and to carry on a general brokerage business in all goods and merchandise of all kinds and descriptions.

That the objects set forth in any sub-clause of this clause shall not, except where the context expressly so requires, be in anywise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the term of any other sub-clause, or by the name of the Company. None of such sub-clauses or the objects therein specified or the powers thereby conferred shall be deemed subsidiary or auxiliary merely to the objects mentioned in the first sub-clause of this clause, but the Company shall have full power to exercise all or any of the powers conferred by any part of this clause, and notwithstanding that the business, undertaking, property or acts, proposed to be transacted, acquired, dealt with or performed, do not fall within the objects of the first sub-clause of this clause, by the name of "Evangeline Beverages, Limited", with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into Fifty shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase and sell, whether on commission or otherwise, and deal in farm and other produce including fruits and vegetables, grains, meats, fish, fowl, game, poultry, livestock, milk, and eggs, and their by-products and other industrial products.

To manufacture, purchase or sell, whether on commission or otherwise, and deal in all kinds of canned, preserved, pickled and cured fruits and vegetables, grains, meats, fish, fowl, game, poultry, livestock and extracts, syrups, jams, marmalades, essences, sauces, relishes, jel-

lie, aerated or evaporated fruits, cider or other vinegar.

To carry on the business of wholesale and retail merchants and of commission agents in all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise, and especially in fruits, vegetables, grains, meats, fish, fowl, game, poultry, livestock, milk and eggs.

To carry on the business of general warehousemen in all its branches, and generally deal in all products, provisions, fruits, materials and goods of every description.

To carry on the business of a general cold storage and refrigerator company in all its branches.

To manufacture, buy, sell, trade and deal in all implements, machinery, appliances, utensils, boxes, cartons, and all things, necessary or convenient for the use of the Company in connection with its business.

To carry on the business as a grower, shipper, exporter, importer and dealer in seeds, farm, garden and dairy products and all other fruit products.

To manufacture, buy and sell, trade and deal in cans, boxes, jars, containers, labels and canners supplies.

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, commission brokers, or otherwise, both wholesale and retail, and either alone or in conjunction with others.

PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 43 of Chapter 29, 12 Geo. V., 1922, all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "a protected area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

No person may enter upon any forest land after May 1st, 1926 until November 1st, 1926 for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing, or picnicking or for other purposes, without first having registered with a local fire warden, Councilor, game vendor, or other person duly authorized, giving his name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip, with dates, and having obtained a registration certificate. Such certificate shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons or Companies shall not be subject to the above regulations, namely: Licensees or owners or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or to their employees, or to the fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, or to persons accompanied by registered guides, or to holders of hunting, fishing, guides or mining licenses or leases; or to Clergymen, Teachers, pupils ac-

companied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts. All persons shall when requested by any fire warden show their license and give the above mentioned information regarding their stay in the forest.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10 and not more than \$100.
