## Government Notices

The Lieutenant Governor in Council under the Theatres, Cinematographs and other Amusements Act is pleased to amend the regulations made on the 27th day of May, A. D. 1926 as follows:

For every billiard hall, bowling alley and shooting gallery used as a place of amusement respectively.

In a village or town with a population not exceeding 3000 a fee of .....\$5.00 per year for every billiard or pool table, bowling alley, shooting gallery, payable as the Inspector determines in each particular case.

In a village or town with a population over 3000 and not exceeding 5000 a fee of .....\$7.50 per year for every billiard or pool table, bowling alley, shooting gallery, payable as the Inspector determines in each particular case.

In a town with a population over 5000 and not exceeding 10,000 a fee of .....\$10.00 per year for every billiard or pool table, bowling alley, shooting gallery, payable as the Inspector determines in each particular case.

In a city with a population over 10,000 a fee of .....\$12.50 per year for every billiard or pool table, bowling alley, shooting gallery, payable as the Inspector determines in each particular case.

Clubs and fraternal benefits associations having billiard hall, bowling alleys

and shooting galleries for the use only of their members shall not be subjected to any such tax.

Every billiard hall, bowling alley and shooting gallery paying the above tax shall be exempt from the amusement tax.
