

Blakney, Ice Merchant; of Sunny Brae, in the Parish of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; C. Hanford Blakney, Ice Merchant; and Frank M. Dayton, Insurance Broker; both of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province aforesaid; for the following purposes namely:

To carry on the business of cold storage and warehousing, and all the business necessarily or impliedly incidental thereto and to further carry on the business of general warehousing in all its several branches.

To carry on as wholesale and retail dealers in and manufacturers of food products of all kinds and in other merchandise of all kinds.

To carry on the business of towing and truckage, in all its branches, and to carry on a general wrecking and salvaging business.

To acquire, construct and operate tugs, scows, lighters, barges, dredges, ferry boats, steamboats and vessels of every kind.

To carry on a general shipping business.

To carry on the business of omnibus, cab, dray, taxicab, motor bus, auto dray, motor truck or other private or public conveyances, livery and feed stable keepers, horse dealers and farmers, grazers, and dealers in hay, oats, corn, straw and fodder of all kinds.

To carry on all or any of the following businesses: general carriers, railway and forwarding agents, storage and warehousemen, transfer and express agents, and any other similar business.

To carry on the business of running motor omnibuses of all kinds and motor trucks at such places as the Company may see fit.

To acquire from any municipality or corporation any franchise or right to operate omnibuses, motor busses, or vehicles which can or may be operated for carrying passengers or goods for hire.

To carry on the business of a wholesale and retail merchant, importer, exporter and dealer generally in coal, coke, peat, oil, wood and fuel and all products and by-products of fuel of all kinds.

To carry on the business of a timber and lumber merchant and manufacturer, and to search for, mine, quarry, raise, prepare for sale, refine and make merchantable, by any process coal, oil, coke, peat, wood, fuel, gas, and all products and by-products of fuel and all other minerals and substances and to manufacture therefrom fuel, gas, oil and products for market, timber, lumber, logs, sawmills, shingles, siding, telegraph and telephone poles, fence posts, wood, pulp wood, and all other products of the forest.

To draw, make, accept, endorse, execute and issue promissory notes and other negotiable and transferable instruments.

To carry on the business of manufacturers of and dealers and workers in cement and the by-products thereof, and artificial stone and other articles composed in whole or in part of Portland or other cement, or the by-products of the same, and

To carry on the business of coal miners, colliers and quarrymen.

To search for, quarry, mine and make merchantable, manufacture, use, buy, sell and deal in stone, artificial stone,

marl, shale, slate, clay, gravel, sand, lime, plasters, coal, coke, fuel and other minerals, metals and earths, Portland and other cements, and all articles composed of all or any of the same, in whole or in part, or of all or any of the by-products thereof in whole or in part.

To purchase, lease, and otherwise acquire docks, wharves and terminals, for and in connection with the business of the Company.

To deal in, buy, sell and otherwise handle all classes and kinds of farm and other machinery.

To buy, sell, manufacture, import and export fertilizer in any and all forms and quantities.

To acquire, lease and take over for the purposes of this clause, and to mine, dig, unsoil, produce, prepare, dress, wash, moisten, tread, grind, refine, mould and dry, clay, clays, brick clay, fire clay, and all other kinds of clays, used and employed in the process and manufacture of bricks, house bricks, terra cotta, solids, tiles, drain pipes, and other productions therefrom, and to manufacture, press, make, mould, dress, shape and buy, acquire, sell, dispose of and generally deal in bricks, house bricks, terra cotta, solids, tiles, drain pipes and other productions therefrom, and the productions of clays and bricks and in anything therefrom, by any process of manufacture, reduction or otherwise, and generally to deal in any product resulting from the manufacture of clay, clays, brick clay, fire clay and all other kinds of clay and material, and generally to carry on the manufacture of clay, clays, brick clay, terra cotta solids, tiles, drain pipes, and other productions therefrom, by the name of "Blakney and Son, Limited", with a Capital Stock of Forty-nine thousand Dollars divided into Four hundred and ninety shares of One hundred dollars each with the head office at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.
