D. 1926, incorporating Harry S. Estabrook, Clerk; James W. Brittain, Weigher; Margaret Edgar, Married Woman, Wife of Walter S. Edgar, Clerk; James A. Stephenson, Traveller; Gladys Noble, Married Woman, Wife of Fred Noble, Accountant; Charles D. Strong, Clerk; Matthew G. Adams, Accountant; and C. Fred Noble, Accountant; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable and transferable instruments.

To sell or dispose of the undertaking of the corporation or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company may think fit.

To do any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise, either alone or in connection with others.

To do any and all things which may, from time to time, be found generally necessary to the carrying out of the objects and the work of this corporation and the full enjoyment of the members thereof.

To do such other things as are inci-

To buy, lease, sell, rent and deal in real estate and generally to carry on the business of a real estate company and for such purposes to buy, lease, sell, rent and generally to deal in lands, houses, cottages, shops, offices, hotels and other buildings and real estate of all kinds.

To carry on the business of omnibus, cab, dray, taxicab, motor bus, auto dray, motor truck or other private or public conveyances, livery and feed stable keepers, horse dealers and farmers, grazers and dealers in hay, oats, corn, straw and fodder of all kinds.
