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PROCLAMATION

By His Honour William F. Todd, LL. D., Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick.

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the 19th day of August, I have thought fit to further prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the 23rd day of September next.

Government Notices

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council under "The Gasoline Tax Act, 1926" is pleased to make the following regulations:

1. No person may buy or receive delivery in this Province of any Gasoline for his own use or for that of his family, agent, employee, partner or employer without paying a tax equal to three cents per gallon, imperial measure.

2. This tax shall be paid by the purchaser, and shall be collected on the first sale or receipt of delivery within the Province and shall be collected by the importer, manufacturer, producer, refiner or distributor.

3. The said importer, manufacturer, producer, refiner or distributor is for the purpose of the said Act, the agent of the Minister of Public Works. Each of the said collectors shall keep accounts, in the form prescribed by the Minister, of all purchases, sales and deliveries of gasoline by him and of the quantities on hand and of the quantity used in this Province by such collector, and render the same to the Minister with a remittance of the amount collected not later than the tenth day of each month in each year addressed to the Motor Vehicle Branch of the Department of Public Works.

4. The account rendered shall accompany the remittance of the tax collected for the previous month and shall be accompanied by an affidavit or statutory

declaration of the collector or an employee having personal knowledge of the facts.

5. The amount to be paid for collecting the said tax shall be two per centum of the amount collected.

6. The Minister of Public Works may appoint an officer whose duty it shall be to inquire and ascertain if the tax imposed by the Act has been paid or collected and if the other provisions of the Act and of the regulations made thereunder have been observed. And for this purpose the officer, so appointed, may at any reasonable time, enter the premises of any collector to examine the place, books and documents, verify the quantities of gasoline purchased, delivered and on hand, establish the correctness of the accounts rendered, and in case no account has been rendered ascertain the amount of the tax imposed that should have been collected.

7. Every person contravening any of the provisions of the said Act or any of the regulations made thereunder by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council commits a violation of the said Act and if found guilty shall be condemned in addition to the payment of the tax that should have been paid, collected or remitted as the case may be and the costs of the prosecution to the payment of a fine of not less than \$5.00 and not exceeding \$10.00 for the first offence and not less than \$10.00 and not exceeding \$25.00 for any subsequent offence to be recovered under the provisions of "The Summary Convictions Act", Consolidated Statutes of N. B. 1903, Chapter 123.

8. Any information laid under this Act may be brought or laid in the name of the Minister of Public Works, but it shall not be necessary for the Minister to sign or swear to any complaint or to make proof of his appointment and of exercising his office and for all purposes he may be represented by the Officer appointed to administer the Act or by a duly authorized solicitor or agent.

To carry on all or any of the business of chemists, druggists, chemical manufacturers and dealers, dry salters, importers and manufacturers of and dealers in pharmaceutical medicinal preparations.

To manufacture, buy, sell, deal in mineral waters, wines, cordials, liquors, soups, broths, and other restoratives or food specially suitable or deemed to be suitable for invalids and convalescents.

To adopt such means of making known the products of the Company as may seem expedient, and in particular by advertising in the press, by circulars, by purchase and exhibition of works, of art or interest, by publication of books and periodicals, and by granting prizes, rewards and donations.

To conduct and carry on a general wholesale and retail mercantile business in goods, wares and merchandise of every nature, kind and description.

To establish agencies or branches in any and all places it may see fit and to do any and all lawful business incidental or in any way connected with the pur-
