"MARK BROTHERS, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Second day of April A. D. 1927, incorporating Hyman Mark, Merchant; Jacob Mark, Merchant; and Hode Mark, Widow; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over as a going concern the business of grocers and provision merchants now carried on in the City of Moncton aforesaid, and elsewhere throughout the said Province of New Brunswick, by the said Hyman Mark and Jacob Mark in the firm name and style of Mark Brothers, and the rights and con-

tracts now held by them in connection with the said business, subject to the obligations, if any, effecting the same, and all the assets and liabilities of the said business so carried on by the said Hyman Mark and Jacob Mark, and to pay for the same with paid-up shares of the capital stock of the said Company.

"SEBATIS CLUB, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Thirty-first day of March, A. D. 1927, incorporating Douglas W. Clinch, Investment Banker; Edward S. Paine, Investment Banker; and Frederick K. Barbour, Merchant; all of the City of New York, in the State of New York, one of the United States of America; for the following purposes, namely:

For the formation of a Club to be known as the Sebatiss Club whose object shall be the promotion of the health and recreation of its members by the pursuit of fishing and hunting, and with such end in view to purchase, sell, lease, mortgage, take in exchange, rent or hire, or otherwise acquire and deal in every way with any real or personal property, fishing grounds and streams and fishing rights, and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or con-

venient for the purposes of the said Club, and to build and erect buildings and other structures in the Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere:

To acquire and hold rights to be exercised by its members to fish in any lake, river or stream in said Province;

To sublet the rights it may have to fish in said lakes, rivers or streams, or to grant permission to such persons as it may see fit to fish in said lakes, rivers or streams, or to shoot game on its land;

To take such action or proceedings as may be necessary to protect the fish in such lakes, rivers or streams, and the game on its land;

To take or otherwise acquire and hold shares in any other corporation having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the corporation;

To promote, organize, conduct and manage the said Sebatiss Club with power to make and adopt a constitution and by-laws, rules and regulations for the admission, suspension and expulsion of its members, and for their government, and for the establishing of different classes of membership, and providing for fees and dues, and for the collection of the same, and for imposition and recovery of penalties, and for the safekeeping and protection of its property and funds, and in general, to regulate, manage and preserve its property and interests, and from time to time to alter, repeal, rescind or vary such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations, or any of them, by the name of "Sebatiss Club, Limited", with a capital stock of ten thousand dollars divided into twenty shares of five hundred dollars each, with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, with permission to hold the annual meetings of the Company without the Province, and also special meetings of the Shareholders and Directors without the Province, such permission being sought by the applicants by reason of the fact that the Shareholders are non-residents of the Province of New Brunswick, and it is a matter of expediency that the Directors and Shareholders may meet at the same place where a majority are assembled.
